We were no longer equipped with the state of the art weaponry that we had grown so accustomed to. We do however have one branch of the Military left, the Army. 


The Army is not willing to fight the war in

the surrounding cities. In theory, if we keep the fighting outside of the cities, then more good citizens with limited options are willing to live there. Up to this point that has worked fairly well. The pressure from a growing number of citizens that are willing to stand up to the rebels, have been pushing them out to the only cover, the surrounding forest. However it is a two edged sword. They now lie low in the cities, knowing that we don't have the coverage or technology to keep them from making their way to the forest at night. This is how they seem to have an infinite supply of resources and personel.

#### Objective:

You have just been stationed at the Coyote Springs FARP to the East of Yocca Forest. This FARP is fully equiped



with fuel, supplies, medical, weapons, and tents for living quarters. It is also equipped with a low powered (1 Watt) NDB on a frequency of 375 KHz to assist with IFR navigation back to it at a short range if necessary. It's morse code ID is "C S" or

You will fly many different types of missions from

sling load operations, troop/cargo transport, all the way to gunship configurations. Some of the flying will be very challenging, as will be your mission for this morning. You will rendezvous with a CH-47 Chinook at the Coyote Springs FARP where he will pick up three "Fire Teams."

Rendezvous Point: Land on the "H" mark facing west.




The CH-47 is too large to fit into the second two LZ objectives "FC001" and "FC002." And the Huey is not capable of carrying all eighteen troops in one trip, so you will fly light to the first objective "FC003" following the Chinook. There is room enough for you both to fly into this LZ. Once in the LZ, hover just behind him until the troops have unloaded and the Chinook is clear of the pickup point. Then hover taxi to the "H" mark and land facing north to pick up your first Fire Team of six troops.

#### FC003



After the troops have boarded your Huey, follow the road southwest. This will run you right into objective "FC001." Fly over this objective low and your Crew Chief will mark it with smoke to make the approach easier. There is an old cell tower NNW of the site that if you fly from will put you on a good approach path for the clearing. Remember to consider your weight during the approach.


#### FC001 Approach



Once you are in the clearing, hover taxi to the drop off point (H) and the troops will disembark once you land your aircraft facing northeast.

FC001





Return to FC003 to pick up the second Fire Team. The third team will remain there. Follow the same route you did to FC001 and then follow the road southeast to reach the objective. It is located on the north side of the road about a mile and half past FC001. Fly over it low and your Crew Chief will pop smoke. Make your approach on a heading of 3-3-2 degrees to align yourself with the LZ's clearing. The Fire Team will unload at the drop off point. (H)

FC002 Approach





To return to base follow the mountain ridge southeast until you can head back north. Also make sure to review the Google Earth .kmz file included with this briefing package to get additional details of other Army Forces' positions and activities. Good luck.
